

Report « Pully under the microscope 2020-2024 »

For the second time, the Municipality of Pully has published “Pully under the microscope 2020-2024”, a report detailing 164 key performance indicators (KPIs) on the state of sustainable development and digitalization in Pully. Based on a methodology established by the International Telecommunication Union and fifteen United Nations agencies, this new publication is enriched by additional indicators provided by the Swiss Confederation, as well as indicators specific to Pully's administration. What is the utilization rate of sports facilities? Is high-speed Internet coverage sufficient? How do citizens get around? How developed are the online services offered by the municipal administration? “Pully under the microscope 2020-2024” answers these and many other questions, with figures, illustrations and commentary, providing valuable information on the state of our city and its development.

Designed as an analysis and communication tool for the Municipality, the Communal Council, the administration and the citizens, “Pully under the microscope 2020-2024” offers a comprehensive overview of the city.

Generally speaking, the Municipality is pleased to note that over 85% of the categories meet the target values or statistical averages, with performance often judged as good to very good, and no category is considered insufficient. Among the 164 indicators, several highlight the city's strengths: for example, electricity consumption for public lighting is 35% below the Energy Cities target, and drinking water consumption is 27% below the Swiss average. Equal pay is respected within the administration, while the average taxable income of taxpayers is 39% higher than the average for cities participating in the “Cercle Indicateurs” initiative piloted by the Swiss Confederation.

Nevertheless, there is potential for improvement in certain areas, notably energy and the management of public buildings. Energy consumption is still three times higher than the norm, and only a minority of public buildings meet environmental standards. Other points of attention include the city's capacity to finance investments, which is almost five times lower than required, and soft mobility and public transport accessibility for people with reduced mobility.

For the first time, “Pully under the microscope 2020-2024” also highlights the evolution of a hundred or so indicators between 2016 and 2021. During this period, 40% of indicators showed improvement, thanks in particular to an 11% reduction in electricity consumption and an increase in the share of renewable electricity distributed, from 60% to almost 100%.

The result of a collective, cross-functional effort involving the entire administration, this report is a true “snapshot” of Pully, enabling us to assess and steer progress towards a more sustainable and connected city.

According to the Mayor, Mr. Gil Reichen, “This new edition of Pully under the microscope 2020-2024 provides an up-to-date picture of the state of the town and helps to steer local policy actions”.
